




STUDENT PROFILESUEANNE AMISOLA



Your inside track to a career in fashion

Opportunities for fashion marketers and merchandisers are both diverse and plentiful. Retailers need merchandisers to drive sales and enhance customer experience, and the entire fashion industry requires savvy marketing professionals who also understand the fashion world.

As a fashion merchandising professional, your tasks may include attending fashion shows, purchasing garments, managing retail outlets and even coordinating advertising initiatives. If you opt for a career in fashion marketing, you'll likely find yourself spearheading marketing campaigns, brainstorming innovative advertising ideas, liaising with designers and working behind the scenes to initiate new trends. VCAD grads are particularly well-trained to take on these important roles.

According to Work Futures BC, fashion professionals with experience in market research and the development of marketing collateral are increasingly in demand, while knowledge of the software used in the fashion industry is practically a prerequisite for employment.

While most aspiring fashion professionals get stuck simply trying to break into the industry, our grads are already ahead of the game, having completed a six-week fashion internship as part of their program.

The provincial and federal governments try to ensure all Canadians have the opportunity to earn a post-secondary education and obtain the skills and knowledge to achieve professional success. You can apply for several types of loans and grants, depending on your eligibility and need, through your respective provincial government. Your VCAD Student Financial Planner is available to guide you through your options and help you submit your application.

Bank Lines of Credit

We've partnered with major financial institutions to provide preferred lending arrangements for VCAD students that are flexible, affordable and easy to obtain.

- Available to Canadian citizens and permanent residents enrolled in full-time or part-time post-secondary studies
- Interest rate is variable, and the loan amount is based on an individual credit assessment
- Pay monthly, interest-only payments on the funds you use, not on the total line of credit
- Enjoy a six-month grace period of interest-only payments after graduation.

Registered Retirement Savings Plans (RRSPs)

You're able to withdraw money tax-free from your RRSPs for full-time education, either for yourself or for your spouse/common-law partner.

Registered Education Savings Plans (RESPs)

RESPs permit savings to grow tax-free until the student beneficiary is ready to enroll full-time in a qualified post-secondary institution such as VCAD. An RESP also allows the student to apply for the Canadian Education Savings Grant.



Other Sources of Assistance

HRSDC & WorkSafe BC Funding

Eligible students can be sponsored by government agencies such as WorkSafe BC (Workers' Compensation Board) and Human Resources and Skills Development Canada.

• Corporate Reimbursement Programs

If you're currently employed, you may be eligible for tuition reimbursement through your employer's benefits program.

MADD Canada Bursary Fund

The MADD Canada Bursary Fund is for Canadian students who have had a parent or guardian killed in an impaired driving related accident and are pursuing an eligible full-time educational program. Bursaries of up to \$2,000 can be awarded to qualifying students across Canada.

Scholarships

From time to time, VCAD offers scholarships for specific programs to eligible students; ask your Student Financial Planner if you qualify for one or more of these programs. It's important to note that there may be additional sources of third-party funding available to you. Many private businesses and community groups offer grants and scholarships to eligible students. Inquire with organizations in your area for more information.

Tuition

You'll be informed of all fees related to your program of study during the admission process. Program costs may include fees for tuition, registration, learning guides, kits and course materials. Tuition may be paid through student loan disbursements or by cash, cheque, VISA, MasterCard or Interac.

General Admissions Guidelines:


The minimum requirement for admission to VCAD is a high school diploma, unless otherwise specified in the program outline.

Applicants who have not achieved a high school diploma can apply as a mature student if they are 19 years or older.

If an applicant's first language is something other than English, and they have not completed their secondary (or higher) education in English, the applicant will be required to pass the College's admission test.

All applicants must provide proof of age and pass an entrance exam.
